This summer, students will need to read one book according to the grade level they will be going into for the 2019-2020 school year. There was a list of books for students to choose from at Book Fair. I have also included the list at the end of this email as well. Students will complete an activity about their book in the first week of school.

Summer Reading Extra Credit Opportunity 2019

This summer, students will have a chance to earn extra credit in reading by participating in a summer reading program through the Louisville Free Public Library or Barnes and Noble. Students will need to fully complete the program requirements in order to earn extra credit. This will most likely be the only extra credit opportunity for reading this year. Students will need to bring me their papers (or a picture of their papers) that they filled out from the public library or Barnes and Noble. A parent will also need to sign the paper. This will be due at the end of the first week of school.

Louisville Free Public Library

In this program, students have to read 10 books, complete a list, and return it to the public library for prizes. The public library will have the list for students to fill out on their website. A librarian from the public library came in and discussed their summer reading program with all of the library classes in May.
