From the Spiritual Father...

Dear Ascension parishioners and friends,

I have lived, prayed, laughed, and cried with you for more than three months now. What a challenging and yet blessed season it has been! While it might be odd, I want to reintroduce myself so that everyone has an opportunity to learn a bit about me. I was born and raised in Saint Aloysius parish in Pewee Valley and graduated from grade school in 1997. The oldest of four siblings: Kevin (Tara), Amanda (Adam), and + Kurtis; I learned early on what it is like to lead by example. I attended Saint Xavier High School, class of '01, and then on to UofL, where I graduated in 2006 with a bachelor's degree in history. Soon after graduation, I began the labor of discerning priesthood, and entered Saint Meinrad Seminary in 2008, graduated and was ordained a priest in 2015. I have a variety of hobbies: gardening, hiking, biking, woodworking, and candle making. I also have a bit of an obsession with old church candlesticks, and because of that, I spend a good deal of time polishing antique brass. I have a dog, and her name is Lady. I often call her Our Lady of the Rectory, but Our Lady of Brown's Lane has a beautiful ring to it! She's a five-year-old mutt, and when people ask what kind of dog she is, I respond with energetic! The rectory is on the corner of Lincoln and Brown's lane. Any time you pass by, and I'm out in the garage working on some project, please feel free to stop by! I'd love to show you what I've been working on! Some aspects of ministry that I particularly enjoy are preaching, getting to know the people of God, evangelization, primarily through social media, and involvement with the school. These interests, manog others, make Ascension seem like the perfect fit! If you are so inclined, I even have a few YouTube videos and hope to do more in the future.

So, that's a bit about me. In the months and years to come, I hope to share more of myself with you and to grow in knowledge and love of you, and your family. One of the best ways, I believe, for us to get to know one another is to have a meal together. These sacred times are an opportunity for the people of God to share in God's bounty and one another. Other happenings around the parish that I would like to mention are the continuing success of our parish school and the upcoming annual Catholic Services Appeal. Ascension school continues to shine brightly with high-quality teachers and exceptional formation in preparing our students in all aspects of being a disciple of Jesus Christ and a good human being. The recent National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence recognition that we have received verifies what we have been saying for years - you do want to be a part of this! Ascension parish school is not just an effort that calls upon the skills of our teachers and administrators but takes the support, and prayers, of the entire parish. These young people are our present, and future, Church and I for one desire to do all I can to help them be all that Christ is calling them to be! Another aspect of going outside of ourselves to support the greater community is the Annual Catholic Services Appeal - the CSA. Our goal for this year's CSA is about the same as Ascension's goal from last year. We have surpassed our collection amount goal for the past three years, and have exceeded, or come close, to our participation goal two of the past three years. So what are our goals? This year we hope to raise at least \$45,900 by 171 households. Simple math tells us that if 171 families contribute \$268, we will once again achieve our goals. Some of you are able, and will be called upon to provide more than \$268; many will be called upon to contribute less. Every dollar helps because it allows us to work on both our monetary and participation goals. I will be talking about the CSA more in the coming weeks but please be on the lookout for the letter from the Archbishop and be open to what God is calling on you to do.

Please know that Ascension is everything I hoped it would be, and more! I am pretty confident that I am where God is calling me to be, and I hope and pray that you feel the same way! If you have any thoughts or concerns, please don't hesitate to bring them to me whenever you are most comfortable. Please know that I look forward to getting to know each one of you more and more!





We are looking forward to an amazing Advent and Christmas Season here at Ascension! One of the highlights this year will be our Community Christmas Cantata as we share the good news and joy of Christmas. This opportunity is open to any and all who wish to be a part of something fun with others and share in the joy of Christmas. This is a great opportunity for families to join together once a week for rehearsals in preparation of a musical program to share with the community. Rehearsals will be on Sundays from 6:30–7:30 PM beginning on November 3rd in the Church. The final performance, open to the community, will be on Sunday, December 15th at 6:30 PM.

Christmas is a time for gratitude, a time for celebration and expectation! And it is a time for music! Songs of the season are everywhere around us, reminding us of the birth of the Savior, the anticipated coming of the Christ Child, the advent of the Messiah, and the JOY that is ours as believers. Check Out What's Happening at Our School

Happy fall, Ascension!

I want to share some news from the summer as well as other big happenings around school:

Ascension Honored as 2019 National Blue-Ribbon School of Excellence!!!!

The Fastest growing Catholic elementary school in the Archdiocese of Louisville was honored for first time since the school's inception 54 years ago.

The U.S. Department of Education has named Ascension School a National Blue-Ribbon School for 2019. This national honor is the first received since Ascension opened its doors in 1965. Adding to the accolade is the understanding that less than one-third of all public and private schools achieve this honor each year.

The National Blue-Ribbon Schools Program is the highest honor any public or private elementary, middle, or high school can achieve in the United States. Since its kickoff in 1982, more than 8,500 schools have been awarded the honor.

The Department recognizes all schools in one of two performance categories, based on a compilation of student scores, student subgroup scores, and graduation rates. Ascension was named an Exemplary High Performing Schools.

Some highlights of Ascension school include:

- Offering 1:1 iPads to all students in grades K-8
- The only Catholic Elementary school in Louisville, Ky with the entire faculty being trained in Project Based Learning
- STEM-focused, with the opening of a Robotic & Technology Lab
- Departmentalized classes (faculty teaching their strongest subjects) in grades 2-8

• Small class sizes, offering an individualized learning approach

"As the fastest growing Catholic elementary school in Louisville, it's an honor to win this prestigious award. We've seen our enrollment growth spike due to a commitment, as a team, to adapting within a rapidly changing digital world. This is truly a testament to our outstanding and dedicated faculty, parents and community," said Ascension Principal Terrence Mullaney.

In November, members from Ascension will attend an awards recognition ceremony in Washington, D.C. where all 2019 Blue Ribbon Schools will be honored.

A HUGE congratulations to Ms. Trinity Shell, our grades 2-5 math teacher, who won the Innovative Teacher Award from the Catholic Education Foundation, which was presented to her following the Archdiocesan Back to School Mass on August 9th.

Nominees for this award must:

Be currently employed, with 1-5 years of experience, as a teacher in a Catholic elementary school in the Archdiocese of Louisville.

Hold current teacher certification in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Have a positive influence on the lives of their students.

Utilize innovative and creative teaching styles and methods that produce outstanding academic results from their students.

Ms. Shell received a \$2,500 monetary gift for her own use.

The 2019-20 school year is off to a great start! I want to share with all of you some of the exciting changes in our school as well as thank those who make so much possible.

This summer, we put carpet in six classrooms, as part of our commitment to 21st century educational practices, painted the elementary wing bathrooms, removed the old student desks in middle school and replaced them with new tables, and have five new faculty on our team (Mrs. Jahnna Harvey -middle school LA; Ms. Erin Raque – middle school Math; Mrs. Vilma Makram – Spanish; Ms. Nina Cornell – grades 2-5 LA; Mrs. Margaret Burchell – Kindergarten assistant; and Mrs. Kellie Hood – Learning Coordinator).

Mr. Jim attended Chenoweth Elementary and graduated from Waggener High School. He has three children, Mary Ann, Patricia and Sid, Jr. and eight grandchildren. 
