

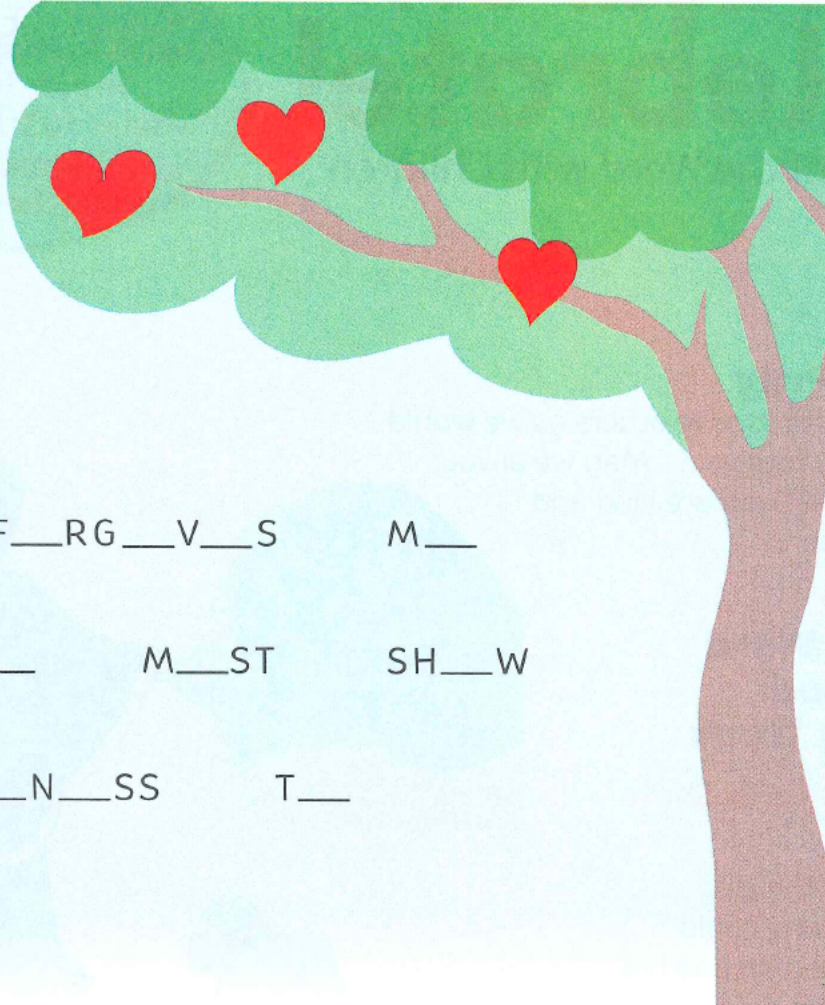

Faith Focus

Children understand what it means to say, "I'm sorry. I was wrong." When caught doing something upsetting to parents, children will sometimes utter the words quickly to avoid punishment. Adults also need to say, "I'm sorry," when a stressful situation occurs. An adult being able to apologize to a child teaches children that we all need forgiveness. Family life becomes better when all members give forgiveness to one another.

Family Activity

Make a poster or large drawing of a tree and hang it on the bulletin board or your refrigerator. Make some red paper hearts. Throughout the week each family member should add a heart to a tree branch each time he or she asks forgiveness from or gives forgiveness to another member of the family. At the end of the week, say a prayer of thanksgiving for the "forgiving hearts" in your family.
